Faculty Fellows in Teaching & Learning is a professional development opportunity and faculty designation that would complement the offering of the Association of College and University Educators (ACUE) Effective Teaching Practices courses. The Faculty Fellow in Teaching & Learning would provide faculty with peer mentorship through applying and adopting the ACUE teaching and learning principles in the face-to-face and virtual classroom to better support students' academic success. The Faculty Fellow in Teaching & Learning will work and collaborate with peer faculty members, ACUE facilitators, a instructional designers, and other staff members within the Division of Online Studies.

Why should I participate as a Faculty Fellow?

Working as a Faculty Fellow in Teaching & Learning provides the opportunity to collaborate with peer faculty and provide mentorship and training on high-impact pedagogical practices and deliver coaching for course re-design based on evidence-based pedagogy. This position will serve to further integrate what research tells us about how people learn in key courses at the college and reinforce an instructional environment designed to support vulnerable student populations, one that honors and recognizes teaching scholars and promotes a learning-community spirit on campus.

What are my obligations as a Faculty Fellow?

This is a two-semester commitment in which the full-time faculty member agrees to spend 3 hours per week working in the Faculty Innovation Center and/or meet remotely to mentor and train peer faculty while creating teaching resources and participating in teaching & learning events on campus.

Topics of interest could include (but are not limited to):

- Designing an effective course
- Establishing a productive learning environment
- Using active learning strategies
- Promoting higher order thinking
- Assessing to inform instruction and promote learning
