# Last Assessment Day – Action Items

#### <u>10/21/2016</u>:

Students will be able to understand and determine meaning of texts written in native Spanish:

- 1a. by translating individual vocabulary words through both learned words (critical/analytical); and,
- 1b. by finding cognates from English or other known languages (creative/critical);
- 2. through knowledge gained/learned of specific regular/irregular verbs and their conjugations and tenses (Spanish 1120-present; Spanish 1121-present, preterit and imperfect);
- 3. through knowledge gained/learned of specific concepts/structures e.g., agreement of noun/article, subject/verb, noun/adjective, use of preposition, numbers, direct objects and pronouns; and,
- 4. culture competency.

<u>Assessment Method:</u> Reading comprehension through paragraph on final exam.

Results SPN1120: We analyzed the final exam results of 107 students taken from 8-week and 16-week sections using two exam versions both with very similar content. The results were positive in all areas with only three questions with scores below 70% (67%, 69%, 69%). Interestingly, each percentage below 70% represented a different question (1,2,3) in each of three areas (16-week Q2, version B = 69%; 16-week version C = 69%; and, 8-week version C = 67%.). The other percentages were all in the 80-94% range with none in the 70% range.

Students will be able to understand and determine meaning of texts written in native Spanish:

- 1a. by translating individual vocabulary words through both learned words (critical/analytical); and,
- 1b. by finding cognates from English or other known languages (creative/critical);
- 2. through knowledge gained/learned of specific regular/irregular verbs and their conjugations and tenses (Spanish 1120-present; Spanish 1121-present, preterit and imperfect);
- 3. through knowledge gained/learned of specific concepts/structures e.g., agreement of noun/article, subject/verb, noun/adjective, use of preposition, numbers, indirect objects and pronouns; and,
- 4. culture competency.

<u>Assessment Method:</u> Reading comprehension through paragraph on final exam.

Results SPN1121: We analyzed the final exam results of 105 students taken from 8-week and 16-week sections using two exam versions both with very similar content. The results were fairly positive in all areas with only three questions answered below 60%: 56%, 54% and 22% and these results from two both 8-week and 16-week sections. The 22% result is from Question 2, Version B is most troubling. The reading and answers are both in Spanish. The text uses a different subject/verb in the preterit (completed past tense) to describe an action than the answer (e.g., trabajaron vs dio).

- 1. Gain confidence by utilizing techniques for managing public speaking anxiety.
- 2. Organize and structure a speech in a logical and grammatically correct manner.
- 3. Identify authoritative sources of information and to properly share research through effective oral citations and a correctly formatted MLA or APA reference page.
- 4. Increase listening skills and retention of information.
- 5. Establish and demonstrate persuasive techniques.
