

Florida Annual Average Wage by County

The state average wage in 2022 was \$63,762. Volusia County ranked 31st in the State with an average annual wage of \$49,872. Flagler County ranked 46th (up from 51st last year) with an average annual wage of \$45,789. These six counties had an annual average wage higher than the State; Miami-Dade, Palm Beach, Hillsborough, Broward, Duval and Collier Counties respectively.
